A brief history of MSAH

Since 1991, the Michigan Sportsmen Against Hunger (MSAH) has been working to facilitate the linkage between donors, wild game processors, and the charities that feed hungry individuals. MSAH is an organization dedicated to developing the resources and infrastructure necessary to channel nutritious high protein wild game meat donations to Food Banks, soup kitchens, and homeless shelters that feed the hungry in the local communities of Michigan.

The MSAH started contracting under the State of Michigan and its newly created Sportsmen Against Hunger Program in 2005 that contract ending 9/30/2024

MSAH was founded by: Safari Club International, Michigan United Conservation Clubs, Ted Nugent United Sportsmen of America, the United Methodist Men's Club, Michigan Bow Hunters Association, Food Bank Council of Michigan, and the Michigan Department of Natural Resources. Other later participating organizations are: National Deer Association. Many other sporting organizations and individuals share in the concern for feeding the hungry of Michigan through their support of our mission.

Hunger in Michigan

This is why MSAH and your community need you! Processors like you throughout the state are coming to the aid of those who are hungry every day. The success of the MSAH processing program relies upon processors to join the fight against hunger and assist us in processing donated venison. The food banking network in Michigan has over 2500 agencies not_including many_church pantries, soup kitchens and shelters in every county.

Highlights of the Michigan Hunger 2022 Study:

14.2% or 1,423,000 people are food insecure - and of them 378,040 are children. Having to choose between funding for medicine, utilities or food, leaves them little hope.

That is **ONE in SEVEN** Michigan residents with **ONE in SIX** being a child.

- Children_378,040 or 17.9%
- Older-adult-50-59_117,300 or 9.6%
 - Senior-60 plus_167,700 or 6.5%

Processor Reimbursements and Requirements

Processor Reimbursement: For 2024 starting 10/01/2024 and ending 9/30/2025, MSAH will be reimbursing our wild game processors \$90 per donated, processed deer.

A. Facility Requirements

a) Processor must sign the sanitation requirement checklist adopted from the MDARD sanitation requirements for processing wild game.

B. Food Safety & Processing

- a.) Included with this packet is the Processing Guide & Sanitation Requirements for Retail Food Establishments from the Michigan Department of Agriculture, Food & Dairy Division
- b.) All processed venison packaging will have some identification that it is venison or wild game not for resale and the date processed,
- c.) All donated venison is to be ground and packaged into 1 to 5 lb. packages.
- d.) Processors are not encouraged nor should they accept Road Salvage Deer or donations of game meat that was not processed at their facility or has been pre-processed by hunter or others. Ok,

Lead in Venison and processing of Carcasses:

You can take steps to keep lead contamination in venison to a minimum by following a few

guidelines:

- 1. Use care when selecting meat for grinding.
- 2. Do not use deer with excessive shot damage.
- 3. Trim a generous distance away from the bullet wound channel and discard any meat that is bruised, discolored, or contains hair, dirt, bone fragments or debris.

A Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development informational brochure is included in this packet for information.

C. Venison Donations

When donating whole deer, the Sportsman or woman do not have to pay for the processing of the donated deer to MSAH. The sportsmen or sportswomen can keep the antlers, cape, or entire hide for mounting from the deer they donate. Make sure to ask the donor before processing what they want or need for mounting. There are two ways in which someone can help MSAH:

- 1. **Donating the entire deer** to the program. There are no charges to the sportsmen or sportswomen.
- 2. If someone wants to make a cash donation to MSAH, refer them to our website at www.sportsmenagainsthunger.org Please DO NOT accept donations on behalf of the MSAH.

D. Voucher/Processing Reimbursement:

No cost of processing a donated deer will be passed on to the sportsmen or sportswomen who donate a deer.

MSAH will pay \$90 per donated, processed deer MSAH for the inconvenience of our processors for processing Deer Management Harvests during regular scheduling of other butchering.

For you to be reimbursed for processing you will need to fill out the Electronic copy OR hard copy voucher that has been provided to you by September 29, 2025 *If* you need processor vouchers please contact the MSAH Processor Coordinator at msahunger@gmail.com. Follow the steps to filling out the portions stating:

- non-profit organization making venison pick up.
- Pick up contact #
- Pick up date.
- Total payment for processing at \$90 per donated, processed deer. Or unless other payment provisions have been made.
